For graduate students, an additional \$12/credit hour is assessed for most Physical Therapy courses.

<sup>2</sup> EMU – A General Education Program Fee of \$14.50/cr. hr. is assessed on each 100 level course in Mathematics, Communications, English, and Science. All Military Science courses are assessed a \$11/cr. hr. fee Program fees are assessed for 300-499 course level courses at the following rates: Foreign Language = \$41.25 per credit hour.
