Sci., Math, Phys. Astronomy), Business (all), and Technology = \$67.25/cr. hr. All other courses (not covered above) = \$46.25/cr.hr. for UG. Online course fees are \$57.00/cr.hr. for all online courses. There is a Student Teaching fee of \$170.00 per class.

²**GVSU** - An Additional \$20/cr. is assessed for International Studies, and Honors (course 200 level & above).
