EMU — A General Education Program Fee of \$15.50/cr. hr. is assessed on each 100 level course in Mathematics, Communications, English, and Science. Program fees are assessed for 300-499 course levels at the following rates: Education (all), Health & Human Services (except Nursing and the Physician's Assistant Program), Arts, Humanities, & Social Sciences = \$54.80/cr. hr. Science (Biol, Chem, Comp. Sci., Math, Phys. Astronomy), Business (all), and Technology = \$62.35/cr. hr., Nursing = \$79.00/cr.hr. Doctoral Nursing fees are \$95.00/cr.hr. and Physician's Assistant fees are \$85.65/cr.hr. All other courses (not covered above) = \$42.85/cr.hr. for UG, \$73.00/cr.hr. for Grad, and \$91.70/cr.hr. for Doctoral. Online course fees are \$52.00/cr.hr.for all online courses. There is a Student Teaching fee of \$160.00 per class.
